



**AGREEMENT REGARDING THE SHIPPING
OF PERSONAL EFFECTS AND HOUSEHOLD GOODS**

Dear Customer:

When you sign the Bill of Lading to ship your Personal Effect/Belongings, you will note that for Insurance Purposes you state a value of the shipment not to exceed 10 cents per pound. (RVNX .10/lbs)

In order to obtain the lowest charge (rate) on your shipment, Carlile Transportation Systems describes and ships all Personal Effects as "PERSONAL EFFECTS, RELEASED VALUE NOT TO EXCEED 10 CENTS PER POUND".

In the event of damage or loss, you will be paid only 10 cents per pound on the claims items. We suggest you contact your personal Insurance Company and obtain a "MOVING IN TRANSIT" insurance rider. Carlile Transportation Systems does NOT have the ability to provide extra insurance.

If you have any questions about this contact the Claims Department at (907) 343 3276 BEFORE you sign this and ship your belongings.

All shipments are rated to Carlile terminals only for customer pick-up and rates don't include delivery unless otherwise stated on the bill of lading. Please understand that after 5 (five) days from notification that your goods have arrived, storage charges of \$10.00 per day will be assessed.

All Personal Effects shipments must be prepaid to Destination by cash, credit card or check.

The agreed or declared value of each article in this shipment is hereby specifically stated by the shipper to be not exceeding 10 cents per pound. I hereby acknowledge that I have read and understand the above supplement to my bill of lading. I certify that I am the owner of the goods, or that if I am not the owner of the goods than I will protect and indemnify Carlile from any claim in excess of 10 cents per pound from the owner of the goods.

Additional Terms and Conditions for Movement of Household Goods and Vehicles (**FOR US CITIZENS**)

1. For interstate and Haines shipments... a copy of the customers birth certificate must be obtained. If the customer does not have a birth certificate customs will accept a passport. (To obtain a passport the customer had to produce a birth certificate)
 - a) The passport tells us they are a U.S. citizen regardless of birth and is acceptable to U.S. Customs
 - b) IS MILITARY ID OK? Yes, it is ok instead of a drivers license BUT WE STILL NEED THE BIRTH CERTIFICATE!
2. A copy of a pictured ID must be obtained (drivers license, government photo, or passport) *THIS IS REQUIRED*

For persons of foreign birth... see Sam Brown for requirements prior to shipping anything.

3. A complete inventory of goods must be provided to the Carlile agent prior to acceptance for shipping. (see below for automobiles)
 - a) Automobiles and vehicles like snow machines, four wheeler, etc. have special requirements in that customs requires Title, Registration and Bill of Sale. If there is a lean on the car, four wheeler, snow machine etc. they need a statement from their lein holder stating it is okay to transport.
 - b) Total estimate of value must be listed on inventory... please remember Carlile Transportation ships HHGS at rvnx .10/lbs
4. Shipper must provide a phone number and full name of person to contact during normal work hours at destination
5. All terms and conditions are exclusive of weekends and evenings (after 5:00pm). Weekend and evening service is available at an additional charge.
6. All quotes are from Dock (Terminal) to Dock (Terminal) unless specifically stated otherwise in the quote. Additional charges will be incurred for pick-up and delivery of goods.
7. Pick-up and delivery is from (and to) residence's sidewalk. Under no circumstance will Carlile personnel enter the residence.
8. Carlile will provide loading or offloading at an additional charge. Otherwise, it is the shipper's responsibility to load or offload goods to or from the rear of the delivery van. Lift-gate or ramp services are provided by Carlile in Alaska and the Tacoma, WA area only.
9. All goods are moved at a release value of \$0.10 per pound. Additional coverage may be obtained through the shipper's personal insurance company.
10. Notification of arrival may be provided at an additional cost.
11. Shipper may not load hazardous materials.
12. A complete delivery address must be provided. A post office box will not be accepted as a delivery address.
13. All goods must be properly packaged or boxed. Material not packaged properly will not be accepted.
14. Material will be inspected, weighed (prior to payment), and all charges must be paid at the originating terminal prior to movement (shipments originating from the lower 48 must provide payment prior to movement to Alaska). Goods stored at originating terminal for more than 48 hours while awaiting payment will be charged additional storage fees.

Shipper agrees to the terms and conditions of this contract as described above.

ADDITIONAL BORDER CROSSING REQUIREMENTS FOR VEHICLES

Alaska – Customs requires 72 hours notice prior to trailer arrival (containing a vehicle). Fax notice to #907 774 2020.

Other terminals can find border numbers for their locations at www.cbp.gov, click on the "ports" tab at the top of the page.

EACH BORDER CROSSING HAS THEIR OWN REQUIREMENTS SO WE NEED TO CONTACT EACH PORT PRIOR TO MOVING THE VEHICLE TO OBTAIN THEIR CURRENT REQUIREMENTS. IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO CONTACT THE APPROPRIATE PORT YOURSELF CONTACT SAM BROWN (ANC) AND HE WILL ASSIST YOU.
